- All trees to be removed shall be identified by either flags or paint
- A site plan or accurate drawing shall be included with the application indicating the location of all trees to be removed. The plan shall depict site features such as the location of the 100' Critical Area Buffer, all tidal and non-tidal wetlands, streams, steep slopes, shoreline and any other features relative to the request. The plan shall also identify the locations chosen for replanting.
- A narrative shall be included with the application describing the existing conditions and the proposed work to be accomplished. The narrative shall include the area of disturbance anticipated and list mitigation measures proposed including replanting and site enhancement, the number and species
- A phasing schedule shall be included with the application if vegetation removal and or mitigation work is to be completed in phases.

Any modifications during review shall warrant an updated application.
