Injury Accident: On 10/17/15 at 10:42am Easton Police responded to the parking lot of WAWA at 8118 Ocean Gateway Easton Maryland in reference to an injury crash. According to police a 2000 GMC pick-up driven by Joseph Schwartz, 66 year old man of Harrington DE backed into a 2015 Honda Accord owned by Heung Chan Oh, 26 year old man of Reston Virginia. Police say Oh's vehicle was parked at the gas pump when Schwartz back into the 2015 Accord causing minor injuries to a passenger, Yuna Lee, 22 year old women of Columbia MD. Police did not cite Schwartz and both vehicles had little to no damage.

Injury Accident: On 10/18/15 at 11:26am Easton Police responded to Ocean Gateway and Lomax Street in reference to an injury accident. Police say a 2003 Ford Motor Home driven by Oattie Lecompte Booze 2nd. 68 year old man of Federalsburg MD attempted to change lanes and struck a 2012 Nissan passenger car driven by Raymond William Hare, 55 year old man of Manchester MD. Police say after Hare was hit by Booze it caused his vehicle to hit a 2001 Dodge Van driven by Darren Matthew Jones, 40 year old man of Ewell MD. Three juveniles and one adult passenger identified as Mary Katherine Jones, 37 year old women of Ewell MD were passengers of the Dodge van and treated for minor injuries. Police say the driver of the motorhome was not cited at this time.

Second Degree Burglary: On 10/18/15 at 12:45hrs Easton Police responded to the 400 block of Trippe Avenue in reference to second degree burglary. According to police sometime between 10/11/15 and 10/18/15 a shed was entered and two bikes were stolen. Police identify the stolen items to be two black Schwinn bikes. Police say this is the third time in the past month bikes were stolen from the local area and any information regarding these past thefts are to call the Easton Police Department at 410-822-1111. Police remind all bike owners to keep a record of the serial numbers, a picture, and secure the bike to either prevent a theft or to easily identify a stolen bike.
